## Maths:

Decimals - to be able to read order, compare and round decimals.

Money - recap and solve word problems involving all four operations.

Time - recap 24hr clock and covert analogue to digital time.

Statistics - To be able to interpret information from charts then moving on to line graphs.

Geometry - properties of shape and describe position and direction.

### Social:

The children will learn the history of Wat Tyler Country Park and also learn about the Anglo Saxons invasion and settlement after the Roman departure.

In PSHE, the children will learn about how to care for the Earth we live on.

In geography, the children will learn about settlements, the requirements of settlements in connection with the Anglo-Saxon invasion of Britain.

## Spanish / Mandarin:

Useful phrases in Spanish and numbers in Mandarin.

Listen attentively to spoken language and join in.

Explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes.

Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation.

Present ideas and information orally to a range of audiences.
Read word and phrases carefully.
Describe people, places, things and actions orally and in writing.

### English:

The children will continue to learn GPS features such as main and subordinate clauses, co-ordinating conjunctions. They will be developing their dictionary skills.

In literacy the children will be learning the features and how to use the features in biographies, instructions and narratives.

In guided reading and comprehension lessons, the children will learn to skim, scan and retrieve, deduce and infer answers, use dictionaries.

# Scientific:

term will be Animals including humans during the first half term then moving onto Habitats for the second.

The children will be exploring the digestive system, types and functions of teeth including tooth decay and food chains.
