

Year 6 Curriculum letter - Spring Term 2026

This term our topic is 'Britain since the 1930s'. This is an extremely important term, where we will be preparing for the KS2 SAT's assessments.

Literacy: Firstly, we will focus on the story 'Letters from the Lighthouse' linked to our topic of World War Two. Different genres will be studied, closely linking them to our topic, alongside grammar features. We will explore features of a biography and instructions.

Maths: Leading up to SATS, children will be studying: Fraction, decimal and percentages, converting units of measure and area, perimeter and volume. We will have a focus on problem solving and reasoning and will continue to revise arithmetic skills.



History: In History this term, we are learning about the Second World War and exploring its impact on Britain and our local area. To bring this topic to life, we will be visiting Hendon on 5th March, where the children will dress up as evacuees and take part in a wartime classroom experience. We will also be welcoming a visit from our local library, who will be bringing artefacts and sharing local stories linked to the Battle of Britain. As part of our wider learning, we will also be learning about the Holocaust and the story of Anne Frank, helping pupils to develop a deeper and more thoughtful understanding of this important period in history.

Spanish: We will be learning vocabulary involving time and the weekend.

PE: Indoor PE will be concentrating on dance and gymnastic. Outdoor PE will be focused on skills linked to hockey and basketball. We would encourage the children to be prepared for the winter weather with their PE kits. After half-term, children will need to wear their PE kits into school on their PE days.

PSHE: Children will be exploring the influence of social media and the impact it has on well-being.

RE: Children will be investigating if it is better to express your religion in arts and architecture or in charity and generosity.

Music: Children will continue to work with Mrs Hayes to develop their knowledge of music composition.

Computing: This term, pupils will be developing their skills in two key areas: creating media and data and information. As part of our work on web page creation, the children will design and build their own website based on our World War Two topic, learning how to organise content, add text and images, and present information clearly online. We will also be learning how to use spreadsheets to collect, organise, and interpret data, helping pupils to understand how information can be presented and analysed digitally.
