Skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can recognise and say all Term 1 phonemes/grapheme listed on Progression Map. I can find and/or write from memory all Term 1 graphemes on Progression Map. I can read and spell words using Term 1 phonemes/graphemes e.g., station, fridge, gnome I can spell read and spell some common homophones. I can apply the rules needed to spell words with different suffixes. I can spell words with the suffixes -ing, -ed, -est, -er when there is a change to the root word e.g., run - running I can correctly make and spell 'plurals' by adding -s and -es when there is a change to the root word. I can read and write sentences by decoding and encoding words using the phonemes/graphemes taught. I can read and spell Set 8 high frequency and common exception words. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can read and spell simple contractions e.g., wasn't, isn't, there's I can confidently apply my phonics knowledge and skills to reading and spelling unfamiliar words that are not completely decodable. I can spell words with the consonant suffixes -ment, -ful, -less, -ly when there is a change to the root word e.g., run - running I can use the possessive apostrophe to spell words. I can read and spell Set 9 high frequency and common exception words. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I can confidently apply my phonics knowledge and skills to reading and spelling unfamiliar words that are not completely decodable, without undue hesitation. I can read and spell phonically decodable polysyllabic words. I can read and spell most common contractions. I can read and spell a range of homophones. I can distinguish between homophones and near-homophones. I can read automatically all high-frequency words. I can accurately spell most high-frequency words. <p><i>By Year 2 children will be reading longer and less familiar texts and with increasing fluency. There is a shift from learning to read to reading to learn with children reading for information and for pleasure.</i></p>
