PE and Sport Premium at Woodside:

- We organise teaching and learning at Woodside in order to meet the needs of all children in the best way
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for children who belong to vulnerable groups and that socially disadvantaged children have their needs adequately assessed and met

We use the PE and Sport Premium to secure improvements in the following 5 key indicators:

- Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- Broader experience of a range of sports and physical activities offered to all pupils
- Increased participation in competitive sport

Provision:

- Enabling all children to access enrichment opportunities through sports giving them the opportunities to try new activities and gain new skills, as well as developing already existing skills
- Providing sports clubs before during and after school
- Dedicated sports coaches to enhance the curriculum
- Providing high quality lessons and afterschool clubs
- To provide at least 2 hours of high-quality PE each week per child
- Provide high quality resources
- Membership to TSSP
- Promote links with sports club
